It involves godly, spirit-filled disciple-makers intentionally investing in the lives of those exploring the faith and inviting those new to the faith, younger in the faith OR peers in the faith, into an honest, open relationship to learn together what it means to be apprentices of Jesus, to live like Jesus, to hear from Jesus and to respond to His direction and assignments.

This is the exciting journey we are on as a church. Our passion is to pursue an intimate relationship with the Lord and to make ‘disciple-makers.’ Our GLOCAL VISION (our commitment to accomplish God’s mission and redemptive purposes) LOCALLY [church & city mission] and GLOBALLY [national & international mission] and every decision we make and endeavour to undertake in Jesus’ name will be centred and flow out of our growing commitment to make disciples who will make disciples.

While we have a long way to go, we have so much to celebrate as a church family. In the pages that follow are some reflections of God’s blessings and activity among us this past year. We are God’s family, united by a God-given mission and doing God’s work according to the principles and promises of His Word—knowing that what we do in His name is not done in vain. I am excited about being part of this with you.

My wife Gwen and I thank the Lord for our staff, their families and you, our church. Thank you for your ongoing love, affirmation and prayers. We feel so blessed to being part of all that God is doing in and through our church.

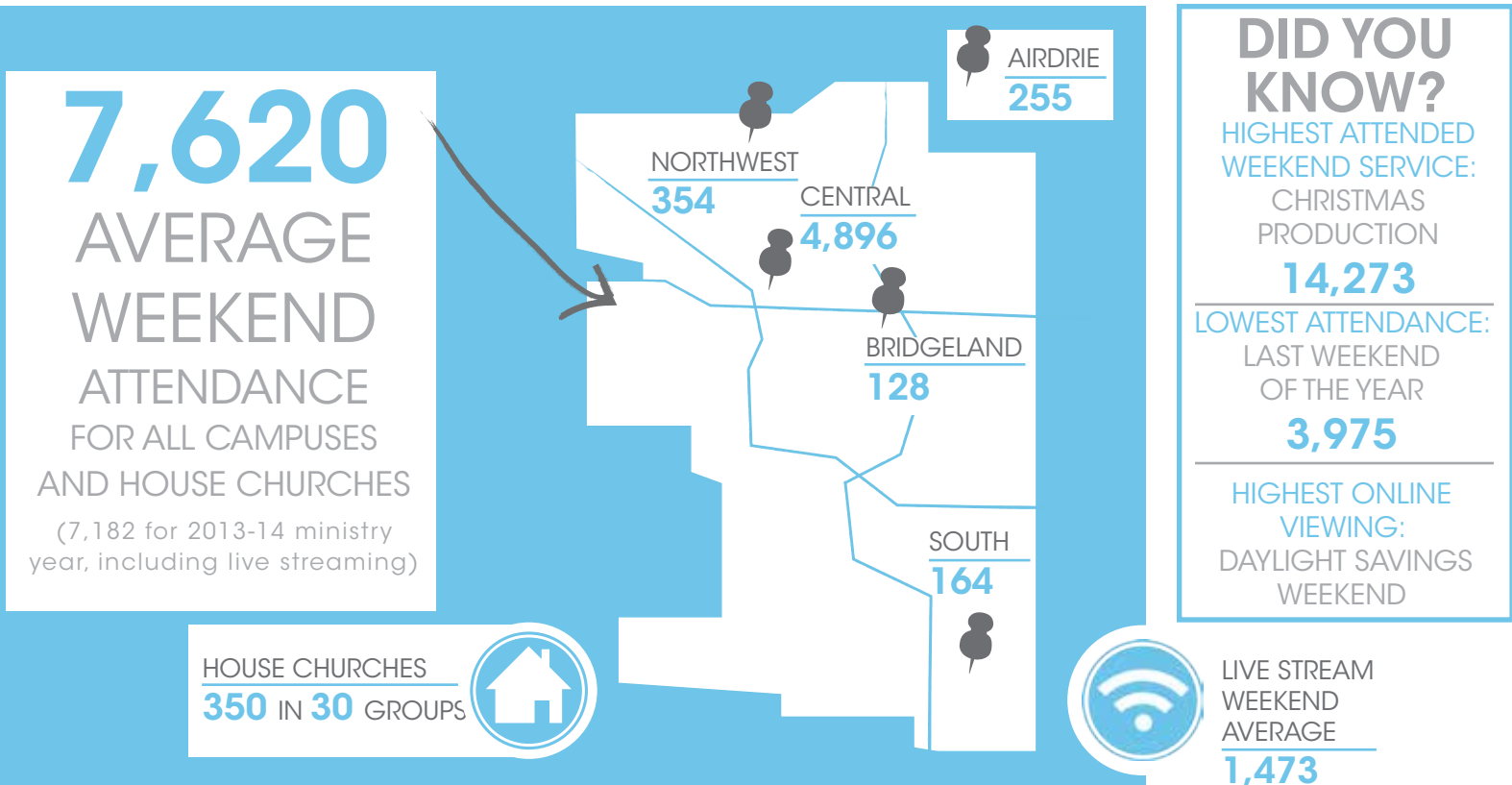

WHY COMMUNITY GROUPS?

God never intended for His followers to live, worship and serve Him in isolation from one another. Jesus modeled the importance of living in community with His twelve disciples, and the early church not only met publicly in large group gatherings but also "from house to house" (Acts 3:46, 20:20). The community group is a place to belong, grow, laugh and serve with others as we learn to love God, love each other, and share God's love with our neighbours and the world.

FIRMLY PLANTED YOUNG FAMILIES COMMUNITY

Children's Ministries has family missional communities that emphasize community building for families, encouragement, discipleship, outreach and strong Christ-centred families on mission. Over 215 people attend these communities each month to grow closer together, focus on discipling their kids, learn how to reach their heart and discover what it means to lead them to be fully devoted followers of Christ. A couple commented, "Our first time we came, we stood outside and didn't go in. We didn't want to. But we felt God wanted us to go and we walked in anyways. We are so glad we are part of Firmly Planted. We feel connected, supported, loved and part of Centre Street Church."

PURSUE MISSION

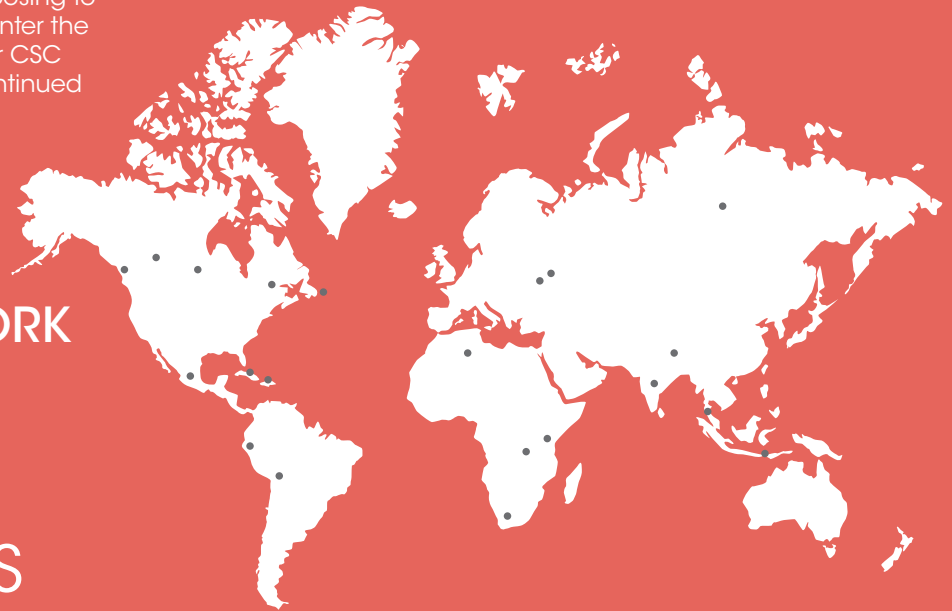

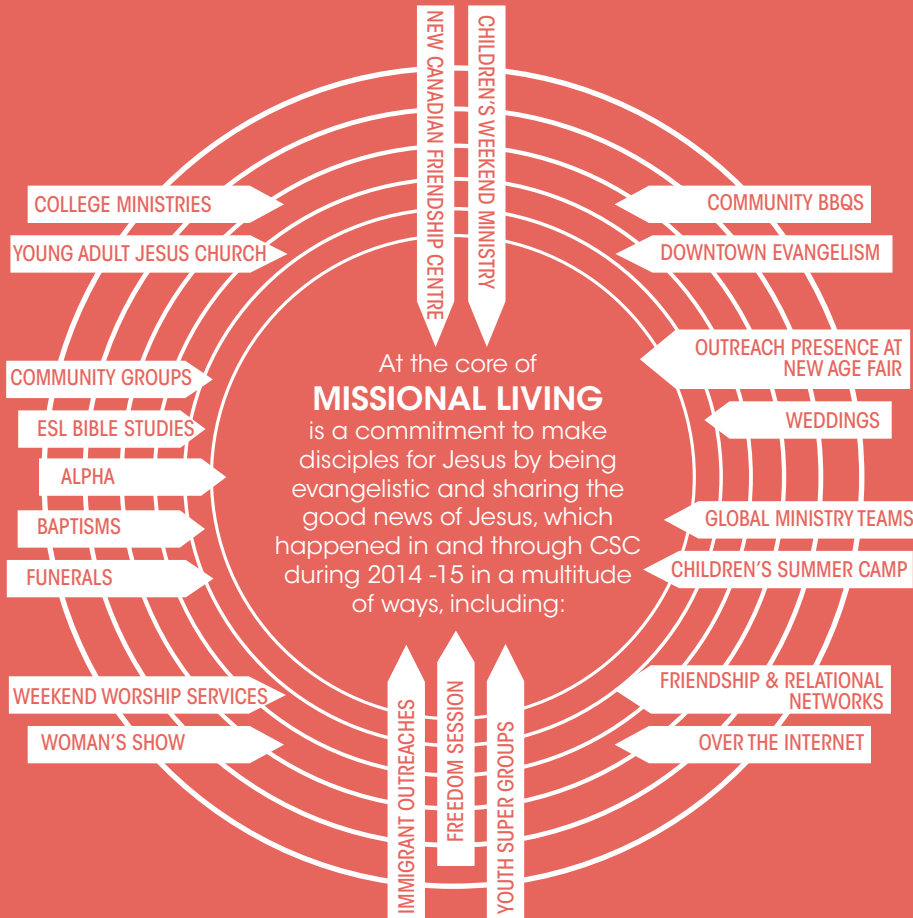

NEW CANADIAN FRIENDSHIP CENTRE

In the second year of operation, NCFC continued to develop relationships and deliver quality ministry opportunities.

After much prayer, discernment and deliberation this year, it became clear to us that God was leading us to become "one ministry, many locations." We did not renew our lease at the Temple location, and God lead us to partnerships with Rockyview Alliance, Encompass Partnerships, Hope Mission and Worldserve to form this new ministry model to serve new Canadians. The same weekly ministry opportunities will continue being led by CSC volunteers through those partnerships, and through four ethic churches we are working alongside.

We are also following God's leading nationally, and partnerships are being explored with agencies and churches with a similar calling to reach new Canadians. We are excited to continue following God's leading in this new model to serve new Canadians.

Faithful giving of financial resources is a core indicator of missional commitment to Christ, who calls His followers to give generously in support of His kingdom purposes.

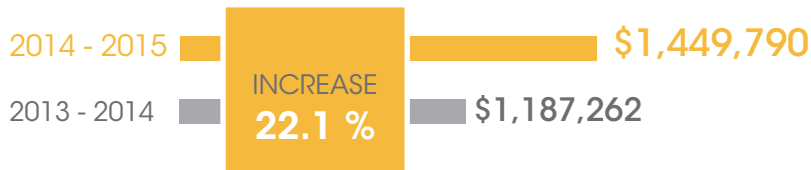

GLOBAL GLIMPSES 2014 - 2015

INTERNATIONAL GENEROSITY

- ◆ CSC helped a local church complete a church/community centre in Pakistan. The church began teaching the people to read and write and are now discipling over **100** women in **9** villages. As women's lives are changed, families are impacted.
- ◆ Following the massive earthquake in Nepal, our partner church remained standing and they were able to welcome their community in for much needed support following the earthquakes.
- ◆ We celebrate the opening of the new human trafficking rescue centre at First AG church in India. They have already been able to provide refuge for many woman and children.
- ◆ In North India, CSC partnered with a local church movement to build a school/church. The principal is now also discipling those in the community.

NATIONAL GENEROSITY

- ◆ **\$20,000** was given to help open the International Friendship Centre in Winnipeg which will be serving New Canadians in Jesus' name.
- ◆ Centre Street's Children's ministry covered the total cost of the seeds and lighting system for Hochelaga-Maisonneuve's summer garden outreach in Montreal.
- ◆ **4** families served in the first Family on Mission in Vancouver through our partner church, Richmond Faith Fellowship.
- ◆ **3** families served with our First Nations missionary, Rob Dilts, in Ontario.

LOCAL GENEROSITY

- ◆ Oakhill Connections is serving **25** new immigrant women weekly through sewing training and English classes.
- ◆ CSC is partnering with Next Step Ministries, helping women who have been abused in human trafficking by hosting training sessions, equipping people to walk with the marginalized in our society.
- ◆ Over **200** Christmas hampers were assembled and delivered to needy people by CSC congregation.
- ◆ Over **500** people came to Central Campus for assistance and compassionate care.

AIRDRIE CAMPUS

COMMUNITY CONNECTION: PURSUING RELATIONSHIP AND GENEROSITY

This year was highlighted by community partnerships. It all started during the Canada Day Parade; we built a float that proclaimed the message: "Dream Out Loud!" – Jeremiah 29:11. Our worship team played music on the float, and families handed out thousands of candies and invites to a Canada Day BBQ following the parade (hosted by Stephen's Backpacks). At Christmas we held a "Serve Sunday" where we filled and delivered 50 backpacks with school supplies that were delivered by Stephen's Backpacks to children in need. Throughout the year we also partnered with the Airdrie Food Bank on a bi-weekly basis, where our youth, grade 5/6 students and multiple families spent many hours serving.

GROWING CULTURE OF DISCIPLESHIP

Our youth and children's ministry worlds have seen intentional movement towards a greater culture of discipleship. Leaders are investing their lives into our youth. One leader, in particular has given youth access to his life and family through shared meals, working on cars, doing renovations and playing sports together. The boys he's discipling have become an extension of their family and are growing in their faith. The formation and huddling of Children's Ministry Leads for each age group has created more of a "Family on Mission" focus and a stronger sense of community and passion for the spiritual growth of our children and families.



BRIDGELAND CAMPUS

PURSUING GOD & RELATIONSHIPS THROUGH FAMILY CAMP

Following the success of last year's camp we decided to do it again. This year we went to River's Edge and were really pleased with the turn out. Over 80 people came! It was wonderful to enjoy fellowship around the campfire, meals and gatherings, young and not so young all together. One real highlight of the weekend was the water slip and slide; the lineup was long as people waited their turn, the men even went four at a time to speed things up! It was a wonderful spiritual retreat.

PURSUING MISSIONS THROUGH DROP-IN SOCCER

Throughout July and August we held a drop-in Soccer Club, each Wednesday from 6-8pm. We provided hot dogs, chips and drinks and a local baker, with an extremely high reputation, donated cupcakes every week. We had nearly 30 volunteers who faithfully came out to serve food, coach soccer, help with crowd control or just to chat with parents who brought their children. Between 50 – 70 children came each week. One of the amazing things was to see the parents engaged in spiritual conversations with our helpers. Each week one of the team shared their testimony. Pastor Tim even had the opportunity to pray with one Muslim lady for her husband. At the end of the camp on the Sunday we had a reward service where we celebrated the volunteers and invited all who had come to the camp to the service and for lunch. Many came including the Muslim family!



CENTRAL CAMPUS

LIFE-SHAPING MEMORIES CREATED FOR CENTRAL YOUTH

Someone invited Brad (not his real name) to attend one of our worship services, and he came and kept attending. One weekend the person preaching invited people to place their faith in Jesus and commit their life to follow Jesus. Brad decided to surrender his life to Jesus that weekend. Someone then told Brad he should be discipled, and he began to be discipled through our 1 to 1 discipleship program. Brad's disciplemaker then suggested he join a community group which he did and Pastor Warren got him connected into a group. After a little while a person on the community group suggested that Brad consider getting baptized; Brad agreed this would be a good thing to do and was baptized. God is always at work around us, and we just have to have the eyes to see how we can help others find Jesus and then grow as disciples of Jesus.

In 2015 Central Campus Youth Ministries sent 51 students on mission. In March a team of 30 set out for Cuba, and in July a team of 21 went to Vancouver. Through serving the less fortunate, listening to stories, worshipping together, teaching, working, sharing their testimony and building friendships many life-shaping memories were created. Seven of these students were baptized, one in Cuba and six on the way home from Vancouver. Each of these individuals were forever shaped by experiencing God and serving others in a foreign setting.



HOUSE CHURCHES

FILLING IN THE SPACE JESUS MADE

Steve and Caylee Cox are leaders of our Intentional Community in Deer Ridge. She wrote about meeting a person of peace the other day: *"I met a lady the other day outside Edo in Deer Ridge while I was coming back from a coffee trip. She was sitting on a bench looking a little rough. Conveniently there was a cross someone had drawn on the cement beside her so I took that Jesus was already sitting with her and needed me to go fill in the space."*

We chatted and she shared her story, her pain and her fears. She is an alcoholic and comes from such a painful past. She has five beautiful grandkids.

I prayed over her, and I believe God wants to break this cycle of sin and abuse and pain she is in today. Steven and I took her to Alpha House (this is her home for the time being). I gave her our numbers. I hope to follow up with her frequently. She needs counselling, family, and to know she is loved. She also needs a home. There may be a husband in the picture, but he should likely be kept away from her.

I know there are difficulties because she is homeless, but I also believe God is greater than homelessness and alcoholism, and He answered her prayers today, and He has a plan full of hope and life for Maureen! I want to be a part of Maureen's story. I don't know what that looks like but I'm so grateful that God uses us."



NORTHWEST CAMPUS

STORIES FROM NW CAMPUS

Close to 100 youth and young adults attended each of our two retreats. More than 15 friends experienced Jesus-community and heard words from the Bible for the first time. Four students made first time decisions to follow Jesus, and one was baptized this summer. One student wrote: "The weekend really opened our eyes to the spiritual warfare happening around us and in us. We decided as a small group to start taking this stuff seriously so we are diving deep into the Word and holding each other accountable on a daily basis."

In the fall of 2014, we launched an "intergenerational missional community" consisting of around 40 children, their parents, some singles, and several older couples. Every other Friday we gather to enjoy a potluck meal together, engage in intergenerational fun, interact around a lesson from the Bible and much more.

Our grade 5/6 small group leaders encourage kids to pray out loud. One of our boys was so scared that, when it was his turn to pray, he teared up and just froze. Afterward, the small group leader spoke with his mom, and they agreed to pray for the boy the coming week. The next time the boy came to small group, he prayed out loud and has done so ever since. Partnering with and knowing each other is so important for meaningful ministry to happen.

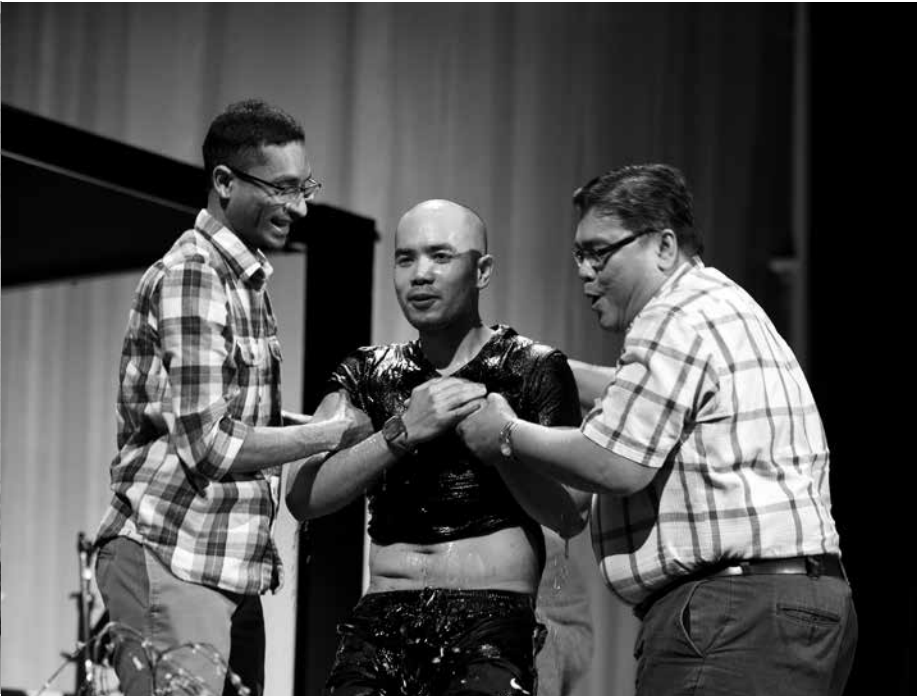
GOD'S LIGHT IN A COMMUNITY

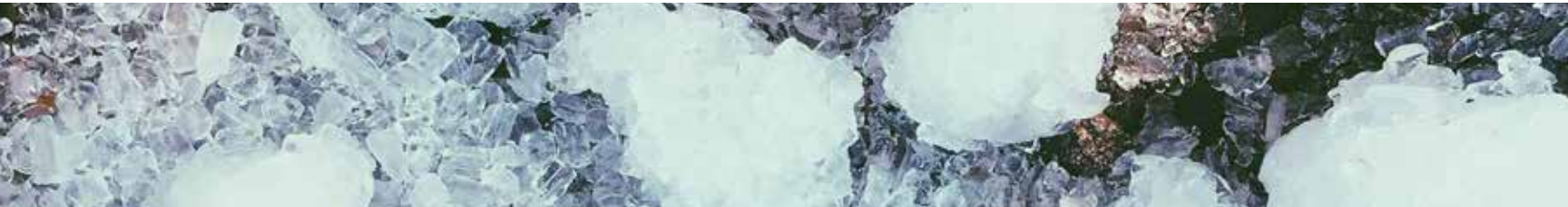
One particular man, M.S., (a Muslim) had been desperately trying to find a job. Scott, one of our leaders, prayed for him, and he started to get interviews. A few weeks later Scott met another man, a believer in Christ named Cabem, who was visiting his sister and observing us and our ministry on Monday evenings. Cabem was a former refugee from Angola, now living with his family in Finland. This 'new friend' and Scott began praying for M.S. over the next week. On the next Monday, they asked if they could pray with M.S. to receive a job. As they prayed, Cabem received knowledge from the Lord that M.S. would have a job by that Wednesday. This was shared boldly with M.S. and M.S., speaking in his native language of Urdu, joined in agreement. M.S. called Scott that Wednesday declaring that he was offered a job that day! Scott explained that he received it because they had prayed in Jesus' name and not Allah's. M.S. followed up by inviting Scott's family over for a feast, after receiving his first paycheck!
